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LUCA: general information

At LUCA, we thrive on being different, on being exceptional. Ranking among the best Higher Education Institutions in Europe, with currently a student population of around 4.000 students, year on year we continue to grow and inspire. With an international outlook and reputation for quality research and teaching, studying at LUCA will open doors and make you stand out from the crowd.

LUCA is the result of a merger between five renowned Flemish art academies and is located in five cities: Brussel (Campus Sint-Lukas Brussel and Nara<u>fi</u>), Gent (Campus Sint-Lucas Gent), Genk (Campus C-mine) and Leuven (Campus Lemmens). LUCA occupies a unique position in art education in Flanders and offers more than fifty educational pathways in Audio-Visual arts and Techniques, Visual Arts and Design, Art Education, Interior Design, Product Design, Construction Technology, Music and Drama and Teacher T<u>r</u>aining. Both professional and academic degree programmes are being taught. Furthermore, LUCA is a member of the KU Leuven Association.

Academic orientation and approach

<u>L</u>UCA's faculty consists of a committed group of artists, designers and theoreticians. As a result of this, LUCA's study programmes are firmly rooted in contemporary artistic developments. Staff members do not impose a specific working method, but coach students in their search for personal artistic solutions. The available infrastructure facilitates both the classical working methods and the application of up-to-date digital techniques. We aim to help our students in developing their own artistic practice and – in the process of doing so - strive to also give them a sound theoretical basis. Students can opt for monodisciplinary, cross-disciplinary or multidisciplinary pathways. Above all, it is the individual student who is at the centre of the activities at LUCA.

LUCA and its networks

LUCA has an extensive international network of schools of art and design, across the world. Furthermore, LUCA is a member of the following organisations: Centre International de Liaison des Ecoles de Cinéma et de Télévision (CILECT), European League of Institutes of the Arts (ELIA), Association Européenne des Conservatoires (AEC) (including AES), CUMULUS, EARN. LUCA is also a proud member of the FILMEU and FILMEU_RIT Alliances. FILMEU is the first Erasmus+ European University Alliance in the field of Audiovisual Arts and Design. FILMEU-RIT brings together the alliance's expertise on research, innovation and transformation with the aim of further enhancing the capacitation in Research and Innovation terms, of the individual HEIs in the alliance.

FILMEU, the European Universities Alliance for Film and Media Arts:

LUCA School of Arts is part of FILMEU, the European Universities Alliance for Film and Media Arts and FILMEU-RIT. FilmEU/FILMEU_RIT brings together eight higher education institutions:

Together, we collaborate around the common objective of jointly promoting high-level education, innovation and research activities in the multidisciplinary field of Film and Media Arts. This consolidates the central role of Europe as a world leader in the creative fields.

EIT C-Accelerate:

LUCA also is member of the EIT-HEI consortium C-Accelerate which is focused on increasing the innovation and entrepreneurial capacity in higher education in the fields of the arts and creative practices. It brings together the 4 FILMEU consortium partners and Aalto University along with several industry and public organisations with strong expertise and participation in different KICs (KICs are Knowledge and Innovation Communities or partnerships that bring together businesses, research centres and universities).

TEAM:

The Teacher Education Academy for Music is a pan-European collaborative research and development network, aiming to reshape initial and ongoing music teacher education (MTE) and school music education (ME) in Europe according to the current needs of music teacher professionalization, digitization, intercultural learning, future viability, sustainability and social coherence. TEAM plans to achieve this by developing evident-based future-making music education Open Educational Resources (sustainability, democratization, digitization) for initial and continuous MTE, by strengthening mobility for initial music teacher education with a special focus on high-quality school internships abroad with intercultural mentoring. The TEAM Learning Outcomes will sum up the knowledge from all TEAM findings and develop this into a useful curricular policy paper to advocate for high quality in ME/MTE in European Countries. A close relationship with European music associations guaranties that TEAM can continue to have an effect even after the project has ended. 15 partner institutions (training schools, initial and continuous MTE institutions) from 12 European countries with a high level of expertise in the necessary areas will work together flanked by a large number of Associated Partners from the 12 consortium countries as well as from 12 further European countries and music-related European NGOs. LUCA: research

Research and Innovation play a prominent role at Luca School of Arts. Drawing from practice and theory, our research cultivates the rich creative environments of our campuses (Brussel, Genk, Gent and Leuven), enriching our students' practice and overall knowledge. Luca collaborates with KU Leuven on its PhD programme in the arts, further demonstrating our leading status as a centre for excellence in the fields of artistic research.

Students are welcome to study as an exchange student for one semester or a full year, depending on the programme. Students will be able to obtain 30ects per semester.

Semester dates

The academic year is divided into two semesters. The first semester runs from mid-September until the end of January. The second semester runs from the beginning of February until the end of June.

On most campuses our exchange students get the chance to take part in an introduction week which is organised approximately a week before the actual start of the semester. During the academic year there are two holidays: two weeks off for Christmas and two weeks off for Easter. An academic calendar will be provided upon arrival and is available online once registered.

Language requirements

Regular degree programmes: LUCA's main language is Dutch. However, we have programmes available in both Dutch and English. All of our bachelor programmes are taught in Dutch (level B2). Exchange programmes are taught in English or a combination of English and Dutch, depending on the course. When the course is officially in Dutch, our teachers will use both Dutch and English during the course. We don't require a language certificate but we do expect our incoming students to have at least a level B2 in English. No Dutch proficiency is required.

LUCA invests in inclusive mobility and is opening/widening international exchange programs also for students with fewer opportunities. IT support

Upon enrolment, students are provided with a LUCA e-mail address, which gives them access to all LUCA's IT facilities. There are computers and printers on campus free to be used by students. Students are connected via Wi-Fi everywhere on campus. Further, a free connection to various scientific databases is available when using the school network. These databases may also be accessed from a distance via a secure connection.

Grading and transcript of records

Exchange students will receive their **transcript of records** (ToR) directly in the online platform KULoket after the examination period. Once the gradings are available, the international coordinator of the concerned campus will send an official version to the student and their international office via mail. If a paper version is required, the student will need to inform the LUCA international coordinator of the campus.

Application procedure

You can apply/study at LUCA as an exchange student on condition that there is an active cooperation agreement between the higher education institute (university, school of arts or alike) where you are currently studying and LUCA. Orientation / introduction week
